A FABULOUS Excursion with Southern Charm. A travel day ending in Kodak, TN. Day 2: We travel to Savannah, GA., where we meet our Savannah Guide for our Historic Savannah "Snapshot Tour". Savannah is one of the world's premier tourist destinations, home to the largest urban National Historic Landmark district in the country. Its stately squares and moss-





draped oaks offer one of the most scenic and historic landscapes in America. The two-hour "windshield" driving tour includes the 2.2 square miles of the Historic District's rich history with its restored 18th & 19th century buildings and the picturesque waterfront where cotton warehouses are now restaurants, hotels and shops. We'll tour The Cathedral Basilica of St John the Baptist, an iconic symbol of Savannah, gracing the

skyline with its towering steeples. Dinner this evening at the Pirates House. ARGGHHH! It was first opened in 1753 as an inn for seafarers, and fast became a meeting point for

pirates and sailors from the Seven Seas. Delicious Food, Drink and a rousing good time. Our 3-night lodging is in Savannah's Historic District. Day 3: We begin our day at the Savannah History Museum.



Located in the old Central of Georgia Railway Passenger Depot, the museum takes guests on a journey through time from the city's beginnings to the present with unique exhibits and experiential activities. A visit to the Andrew Low House. Stunning from the oustide, breathtaking within, its history will inspire you at this beatiful 19th centure home in the heart of



the Savannah's National Historic Landmark District. A Savannah River **Boat Lunch Cruise** with a narrated harbor tour too. Come ready to relax and feast on a delicious southern style buffet all while cruising along the



Savannah River listening to our Captain's intriguing tales and historic facts. This afternoon,

experience a guided Atlantic Ocean Low Country Tour: We'll visit the Byrd Cookie Company flagship store, located at the Factory. You can smell the cookies baking from the parking lot! Enjoy a



cookie-tasting and browsing their marketplace for a huge selection of locally made gourmet foods. We'll view the outlying areas that showcase river inlets, marshes and tidal creeks as we travel Savannah's Beach at Tybee Island. Hear about the Fort Pulaski National Monument & Park



followed by a brief overview of the Island's unique Coastal living style, and then we stop & unload for a photo op and a beach walk to experience the Atlantic Ocean sand & water on your toes! This evening's dinner is at the Famous Lady & Sons. Paula Deen's flagship restaurant is where charm and character collide and now features a unique family-style dining experience. In true Southern tradition, they serve a family-



style spread of hearty down-home dishes along with Paula's famous sides to be selected and





shared by the table. Day 4: Traveling South to the Golden Isles today. First stop - Jekyll Island. Situated within the chain of the Golden Isles, Jekyll Island is a beautiful blend of serenity and discovery. We'll enjoy a Historic Trolly Tour of the Island. Lunch on your own at the St

Simons Island Pier Village. This afternoon a guided St Simons Island Tour. See it's distinctively charming beach lifestyle that is unhurried and under-developed. Before we depart, Dinner at Iguana's Seafood Restaurant. Famous for their locally caught sweet Wild Georgia shrimp and scallops. Harvested right off the coast of Georgia and hand prepared. It's Shrimply the Best! Day 5: We leave Georgia





for Hilton Head Island in South Carolina. Hilton Head Island is a wonderland of white-sand beaches, tidal creeks, towering live oaks, and winding pathways. A place where classic small-town charm meets refined coastal elegance. A guided tour of America's Favorite Island with stops at the Beach and Shelter Cove. Lunch on your own before departing for Charleston. After checking into our 3-night stay hotel, enjoy

our dinner at Galpao Gaucho Brazilian Steakhouse.







Day 6: This morning, a Boone Hall Plantation Tractor Tour. Boone Hall Plantation was founded in 1681 when Englishman Major John Boone came to Charleston and established a lucrative plantation and gracious home on the banks of Wampacheone Creek. The family and descendants of Major Boone were influential in the history of South Carolina, the colonies and the nation. We begin with a

tractor tour around the entire 738 acres that make up the plantation. You will see and learn about the history of Boone Hall and experience how it remains a working farm A Guided mansion tour of the first floor lets you see how this Georgian-





designed home blends recovered materials and antique furnishing to create an atmosphere that would have surrounded a Coastal Carolina planter's Family. Witness "Exploring the Gullah Culture", a unique presentation where that difference can be experienced first-hand. Boone Hall is the only plantation in the Charleston area to present a live presentation of this unique culture adapted by African slaves. True descendants of the Gullah people present the history of this culture through

storytelling, song, and dance that is at times educational, at times entertaining, and at times...very moving and emotional. Lunch on your own at Charleston Old



City Market. This afternoon, an Historic Charleston Overview tour. We'll see the College of Charleston, Harleston Village, the Citadel-Military College of SC., and of course the famous Battery with its elegant town houses built by planters and merchants in the 18th & 19th

centuries. Then a Historic Charleston Carriage Tour where we enjoy the sights of



Charleston the way your ancestors did, aboard a horse-drawn carriage. This leisurely ride through the narrow streets and alleyways carries you past carefully restored 18th and 19the century homes and buildings. Our knowledgeable guide relates 300 years of history to the accompaniment



of horse's hoofs clopping along the pavement. Dinner this evening at Mrs Rose's Fine

Dining. Day 7: A visit to Fort Sumter a Tour and Cruise. On the ferry ride to Fort Sumter, you will hear interesting and important historical facts to prepare you for your visit. Once on the fort, National Park Service





rangers offer an orientation on the history of the fort. Enjoy the museum filled with historical artifacts and detailed information on the construction and history of the fort. Stroll the grounds, see the historic cannons and wayside markers, while experiencing the incredible views of the city from

the top of the fort. Stand on the grounds where America's deadliest war began at Fort Sumter and Fort Moultrie National Historical Park. The first shots were fired upon Fort Sumter, igniting a conflict that saw more than 700,000 casualties. Next, a stop at the Charleston Tea Plantation "Taste of Tea" Tour. We begin with a delicious Boxed Lunch in their scenic picnic area surrounded by Live Oak Trees. Over 100 years ago, tea





planters brought their finest tea bushes from China, India, and Ceylon to the S. Carolina Low Country. Now the descendants of those very plants are growing strong at the nation's only tea plantation, nestled on a serene sea island near the historic city of



Charleston. You will see thousands of tea plants growing on acres and acres of rich and fertile Low Country soil. An informative narrated **Trolley tour** of the fields as well as the factory, where the tea is produced. A visit to Angel Oak Park and the Oak tree that is estimated to be 400-500 years old. It stands 66.5 ft tall, measures 28 ft in circumference, and produces shade that covers 17,200 square feet. Its longest branch distance is 187 ft in length. Dinner will be at





the James Island Crab House. Day 8: We begin our journey toward home with a stop at the Billy **Graham Library,** a 40,000 square foot state of the art experience that invites visitors to discover the remarkable ways God has used a humble farmer's son to nearly eight decades of ministry. Lodging in Beckley WV. Day 9: Our final day from our journey to the Classic Southeast Coast.
