The Allan Herschell Company, the most prolific maker of carousels, specialized in producing portable machines which could be used by traveling carnival operators. The company produced over 3,000 hand carved

wooden carousels and outproduced all its rivals in the carousel industry. Each hand-carved wooden carousel featured striking yet simple horses. Of the 148 antique, hand-carved wooden carousels still in existence in the United States and Canada today, 71 were manufactured in Buffalo. Our guided tour ends with a ride on the 1916 #1 Special carousel. A little free time to explore on you own at the Niagara Falls State Park, America's Oldest State Park or downtown. Lunch on your own. Tonight, Dinner at Top of the Falls Restaurant located

on Goat Island, overlooking Terrapin Point in the State Park.







It features panoramic views of Horseshoe Falls through floor-to-ceiling windows and an outdoor dining deck; you can watch the rushing water cascade over Niagara Falls as you dine. Day 3: We

continue East to Rochester NY. Visit the George Eastman Home Museum. See the world through more than one lens. The pioneer of popular photography and

motion picture film. Founded in 1947, it is the world's oldest photography museum and one of the oldest film archives. The historic mansion and gardens provide a glimpse into the life of one of the greatest American innovators and entertainers in the first decades of the twentieth century. Photo stop at the. View the tallest of the three waterfalls on the Genesee River, which flows through the City of Rochester. High Falls is a 96-foot waterfall in the center of



downtown Rochester. Lunch at the Genesee Brewhouse. An Afternoon of travel to the Riveredge Resort, our lodging for the next 2 nights in Alexandria Bay NY. river along this international waterway. Enjoy dinner at the resort this evening.






He would leave a lasting impact upon the nation, expanding the powers of the presidency, advocating consumer protection laws and regulation of big business, supporting conservation of the environment, and asserting America's authority abroad.
