Beautiful Small Town in America" by USA Today and Travel/Leisure. Also, the **Bourbon Capital of the World**, we visit the **Heaven Hill Distillery**. For over 85 years, the family-owned distillery has crafted fine American Whiskey. Learn their story in the 1935 theater and let the galleries

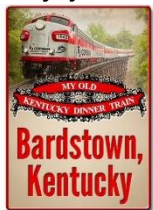
guide you through the history and heritage of America's native Spirit. We will take a **Rickhouse Tour**. See where bourbon barrels are aged. Aging in its facilities is the second-largest holding of Kentucky whiskey in the world. Step back in time at the 100-year-old **Hurst Drug Store** with its one-stop-shop with a pharmacy, gift shop, and home to one of the very few remaining old fashioned soda fountains! Treat



anyone! A Delicious, your choice, Dinner at the **Old Talbott Tavern** built in 1779 and is the oldest Western Stagecoach stop in America and home to the oldest bourbon bar in the world. This evening, enjoy **The Stephen Foster Story**, a Broadway-style show centered around the music of one of America's first recognized composers, Stephen Collins Foster, considered one of the earliest published American composers to write songs based on American themes. Some of Foster's biggest hits, such as Oh! Susannah, Camptown Races, & My Old Kentucky Home help tell the era's story, including the hardships and horrors the enslaved people lived through. The Stephen Foster Story is one of Bardstown's longest traditions. **Day 2:** My Old Kentucky Home State Park with a Guided tour of the **Stephen Foster Home**, an 1818 Federal style Mansion. The 19th-century mansion's



exquisite rooms are filled with priceless 200-year-old original artifacts, the lush formal gardens, and hear the song, "My Old Kentucky Home" performed for you by our talented guide. Enjoy a Culinary Biscuit Demonstration and learn to make the perfect southern ham biscuit. Our Lunch today is on the



My Old Kentucky Dinner Train. A unique fine dining experience that takes place aboard beautifully restored 1940s dining cars. We'll enjoy a 2.5-hour journey through the scenic Kentucky countryside while indulging in a gourmet, multi-course meal prepared fresh on the train.
