You have heard about the FALL in New England and now is your chance to see it for yourself!

Day 1: A relaxing drive through Ohio to Syracuse NY. Day 2: Today, we pick up our New England Guide for the next five days and make our way to Manchester, Vermont and the Hildene, the Lincoln Family

Home. It is the former summer home of Robert Todd Lincoln and his wife Mary Harlan Lincoln. The 412-acre estate with its Georgian revival mansion and 14 historic buildings includes the home, formal garden & observatory; the historic carriage barn; 1903 Pullman car, Sunbeam; a solar powered goat dairy and cheese-making facility. Hildene is formed from two old English words: "Hil" meaning "hill" and "dene" meaning "valley with stream." Robert and his wife Mary





gave their Vermont home this name because it is perched on a hill overlooking the Taconic Mountains to the west, the Green Mountains to the east, and the Battenkill river flowing through the great Battenkill Valley below. The last Lincoln Descendant Mary Todd Lincoln Beckwith lived there until her death in 1975. Continue to Concord NH for the next two nights. Enjoy Dinner at the Common Man Restaurant for a

Good American New England Flaire. Day 3: Experience the majesty of Lake Winnipesaukee during a

narrated scenic boat tour aboard the historic M/S Mount Washington. Learn about the history of the region and local folklore, surrounded by some of the most beautiful scenery in New England. Lunch (oyo) in Wolfeboro NY. An Afternoon in Moultonborough to visit the Castle in the Clouds. This 20th century mansion is set





amid the Ossipee Mountains, with spectacular vistas of the mountains and the Lake. It features a 16-room Arts and Crafts mansion, stable and six-car garage, two gatehouses, a greenhouse, a golf course and tennis court, a man-made lake, a boathouse on Lake Winnipesaukee, and miles of carriage and bridle trails. Later, it's off to Meredith NH. for Dinner at the Harts Turkey Farm. In

1954, the Hart Family opened the Lakes Region's original farm -to-fork restaurant. A 12-seat restaurant specializing in delicious turkey dinners. It has been a family endeavor ever since. "Quality, Service and Home-style cooking" has remained the restaurant's highest priority. Today, they can seat 500 guests. Day 4: We

make our way to Lincoln where we take the scenic Kangamanus Highway



to North Conway. We take a journey on the Conway Scenic Notch Train, where we'll enjoy some of the finest natural scenery in the world. We travel through spectacular Crawford Notch—past sheer bluffs.



steep ravines, cascading brooks and streams, panoramic mountain vistas, and across the famed Frankenstein Trestle and Willey Brook Bridge-enroute to Crawford Depot. One of the premier scenic train rides in the East, the Crawford Notch excursion allows us the opportunity to relive a legend written in the annals of railroad history, when the first train traveled through Crawford Notch over 128 years ago. Live commentary includes history and folklore of the railroad and

area, as well as points of interest. Following our train ride, travel to **Montpelier,** Vermont. A visit to the

Vermont Statehouse-one of the oldest and best preserved of our nation's state capitols. After nearly 160 years it remains an icon in the smallest capital city in America. Its House and Senate chambers are the oldest active legislative halls in the United States that have preserved their original interiors. At the Morse Sugar







Farm we learn the history of maple sugaring and to sample their products. For eight

generations the Morse family has been producing maple sugar. We arrive at the **Commodore's Inn** in Stowe where we'll spend the next two nights with dinner.

Day 5: Today a visit to the Cold Hollow Cider Mill. to see the production of their delicious cider and enjoy free samples of cider as well as other products produced on the premises.

We make our way to Huntington, Vermont and the Birds of Vermont Museum. Discover over 500 life-like wood carvings, Wild birds at feeders and beyond. A quick visit to Lake Champlain Chocolates. Learn why

these legendary chocolates call Vermont home. A sample too! After lunch (oyo), Explore the **Shelburne Museum**, the largest art and history museum and most popular in northern New England. The Museum's 45-acre campus is comprised of 39 buildings, 25 of which are historic and were relocated to the Museum. Among the most beloved attractions are the Shaker design Round Barn, a General Store, a carousel,

and the 220-foot sidewheel steamboat Ticonderoga. Our next stop will be at the popular Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream factory, where we have a tour followed by some more free sampling. Day 6: Begin at Canteen Creemees. An early sweet treat. We

make our way to Weybridge and the Morgan Horse Farm. Colonel Joseph Battell commissioned the Weybridge Stock Farm in 1878 to house his collection of the eras finest Morgans. His passion for

preserving the Morgan breed led him to publish the first few volumes of the Morgan horse registry, saving the breed from extinction. In 1907 it became the US Government Morgan Farm, A cavalry remount station. The University of Vermont

becomes the farm's steward in 1951. Today the over 40 Morgan horses that call the UVM Morgan Horse Farm home are decedents of Colonel Battell's herd and live in the same historic home of their ancestors.



A late Lunch in Woodstock before making our way to White River Junction and to view the Quechee Gorge, known as Vermont's "Little Grand Canyon". The gorge is 165 feet deep and was carved out by the Ottauquechee River. A must visit to the historic **Vermont Country Store**, offering thousands of hardto-find products. The general store and catalog business, founded in 1946, was built on the premise that all our merchandise must be durable and above all practical. Overnighting in Greenfield MA with a Farwell Dinner.





Day 7: A Morning stop at the **Yankee Candle Store** in South Deerfield before we begin our journey home. Overnighting in Painted Post NY. Day 8: Our final leg home with meals and rest stops along the way.
